Sherri,

Thank you. A few follow up questions below and an additional question about statistics in blue below.

1. Do you track how long the vehicles are out when they are picking up ballots from drop boxes? Or how long it takes vehicles to drop off ballots after they are picked up from a ballot drop box? No, we do not track exactly how long it takes the teams to pick up drop boxes. However, we know when the teams start and have a good estimate of the time it will take for the team to finish their assignment.
2. When the ballots from a drop box are put into a bag, are they sealed at the pick up site? For example, with a zip tie? Yes, they are sealed. What method is used to seal the bags? Is there an identification on the bag that tells you from which ballot drop box the bag originated? Are the bags weighed before they are put into the vehicles? Or do you only weigh them when they arrive at the County Government Center?
3. In the field, are the ballots from a drop box kept in a bag only with ballots from that drop box? Or are they mixed with ballots from other drop boxes? Yes, we hire reliable teams to pick up ballots. The ballots are not mixed with ballots from other drop boxes. Pick-up bags are sealed, and then transported directly to the County Government Center. Do you hire the individuals on the team individually or through a contract? How are the ballots stored once they are brought to the County Government Center?
4. Do you track who is picking up ballots and which drop boxes they will pick them up from? Yes. The teams have assigned locations.
5. Do you allow watchers when you empty and transport ballots from ballot drop boxes? Yes. Do you set a schedule ahead of time to let the public know when the clerk's office will be doing things like collecting ballots from ballot drop boxes, conducting signature verification, duplicating ballots, adjudicating ballots, etc.? I know a lot of people who are very interested in watching every part of the election process for the 2021 municipal elections and the 2022 elections, so it would be great if there is a schedule ahead of time so that people can coordinate and be at the appropriate locations at the right time.
6. Are there chain of custody logs or spreadsheets where data about the ballot drop boxes is tracked? Yes. Great. I submitted a GRAMA request for this information within the past week. I look forward to seeing what is in the logs.
7. Do you track how many ballots your office duplicated and adjudicated in each election? If yes, I would like this data for both the 2018 and 2020 General Elections.

I look forward to your responses and appreciate your help. If you think it would be easier to talk over the phone or Zoom, I am happy to set that up as well. Thanks.

The State Vital Records does a match of deceased voters in the statewide database every two weeks. If a voter is identified in that list as deceased, it puts that record into a "suspense" status.

We also check the obituaries on an ongoing basis and put voters identified in the obituaries as suspended in the database.

Often times the surviving family members notify us of a deceased family member.

We sent the ballot order to the printer on September 27<sup>th</sup>. [REDACTED] could have been deceased after the ballot order was placed. I could not find his name in the obituaries. However, the signature verification and the fact that voters are signing the **sworn affidavit** on the ballot return envelope, has secured our vote-by-mail elections.

If the caretaker had called us, we could have explained this to her.

Even if we could physically visit each location I cannot guarantee that my hotspots would work on Tuesday. Connections to different cellular towers and cellular data network load balancing could change how we would connect to the state. This project should have been planned and executed in a more collaborative manner so we could avoid this crisis. Here are some of the problems that, I see, could occur for us without near live connectivity:

- We will not be able to process any paper ballots from Monday until late Wednesday morning. We will likely receive 100k+ ballots on Monday and Tuesday and we cannot process any of them until we manually sync about 250 laptops Wednesday morning.
- The chance of someone voting twice goes up a lot especially voting twice at two different Vote Centers.
- We will need to alter and/or add release days to our schedule because of the ballot processing delay.
- Reduced number of paper ballots decks involved in the audit.

Here are some of the things that we will need from you:

- A phone number to a help line that someone will be answering all day on Monday and Tuesday.
- A plan on your end to quickly add hotspots to the "whitelist".
- A list of the information you need from us that will allow you to add a hotspot to the "whitelist".

When it comes to things that could interfere with voting I tend to see things very black and very white. Please let me know about any information as soon as you can. Thank you.

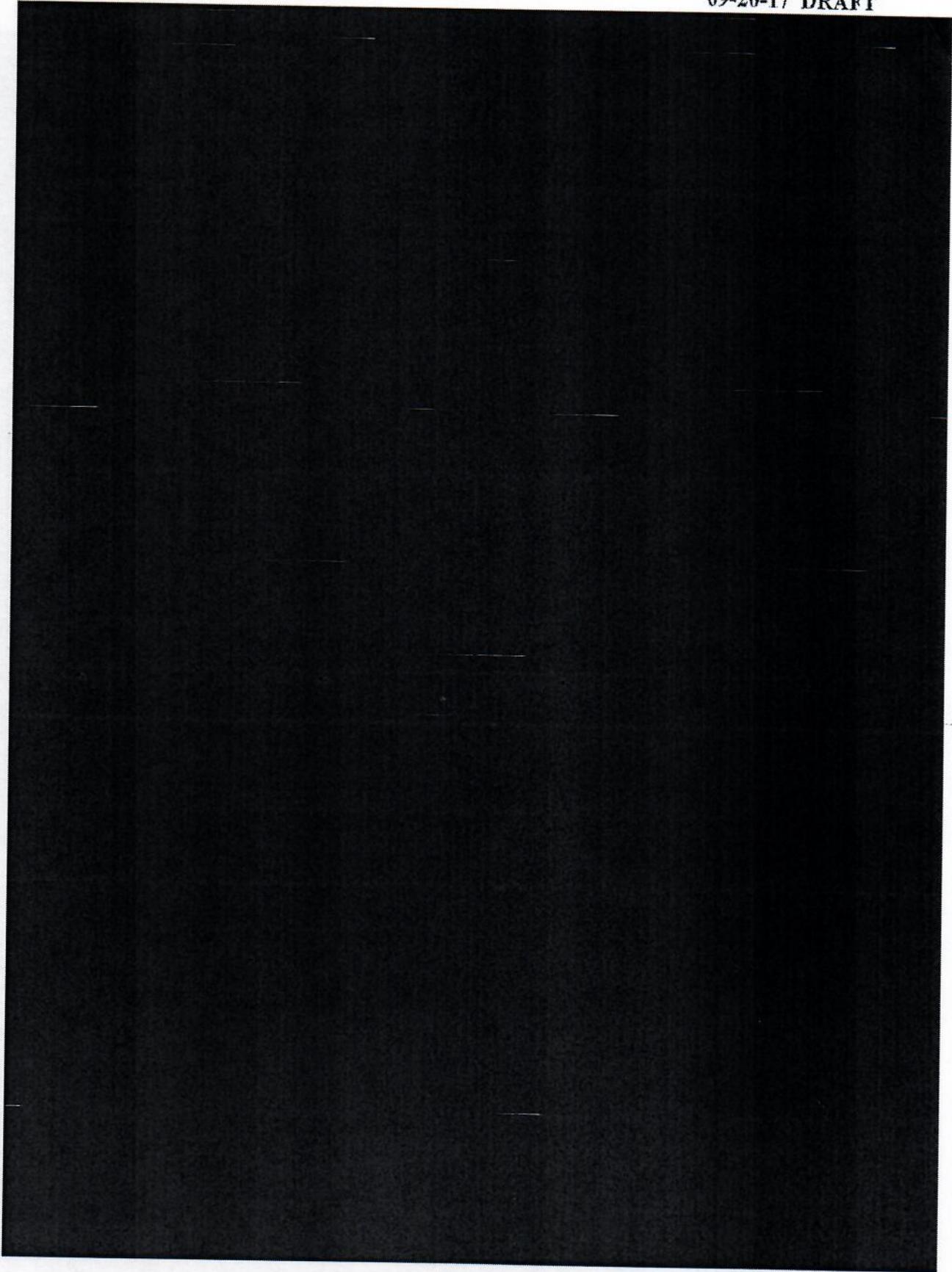
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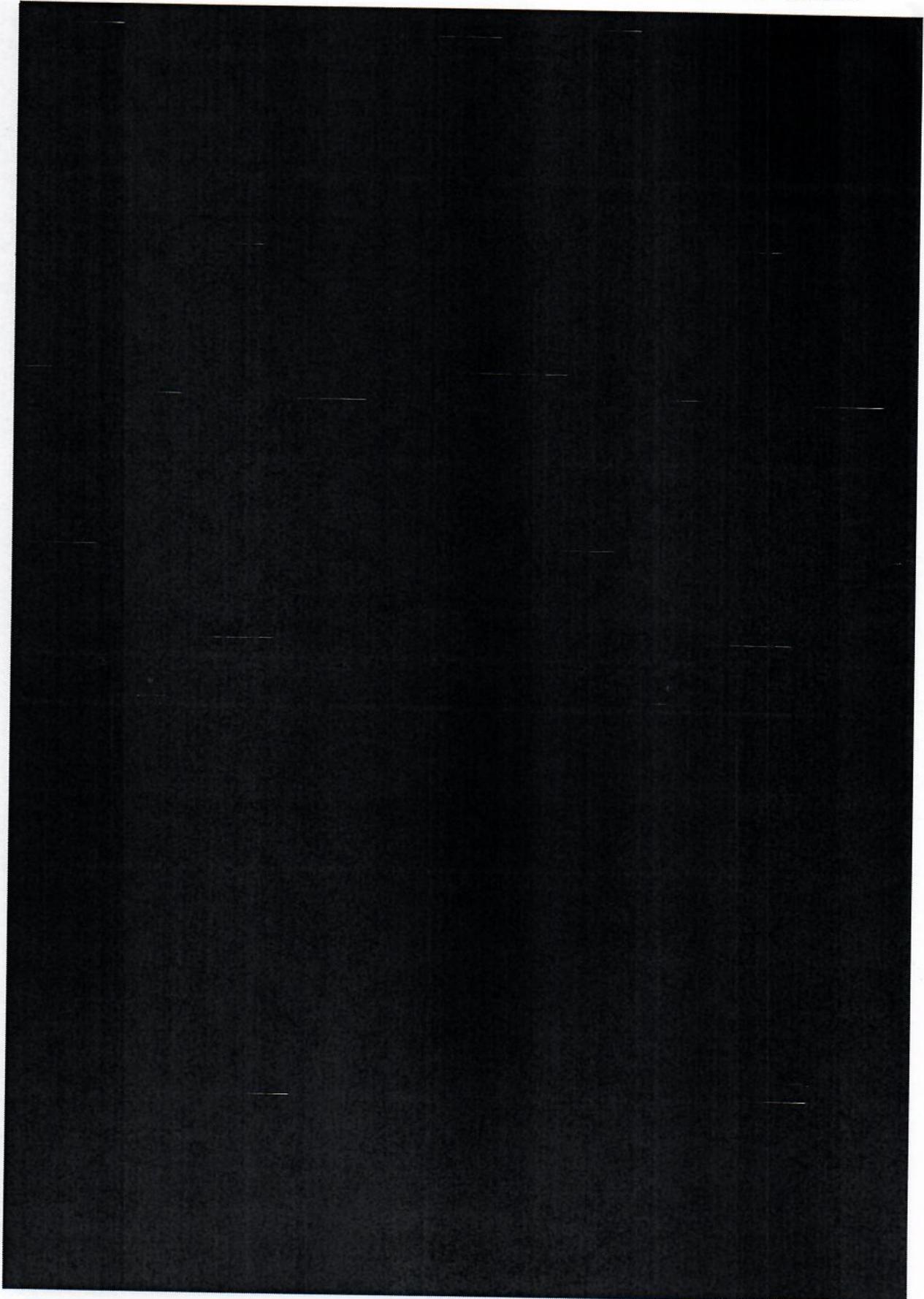
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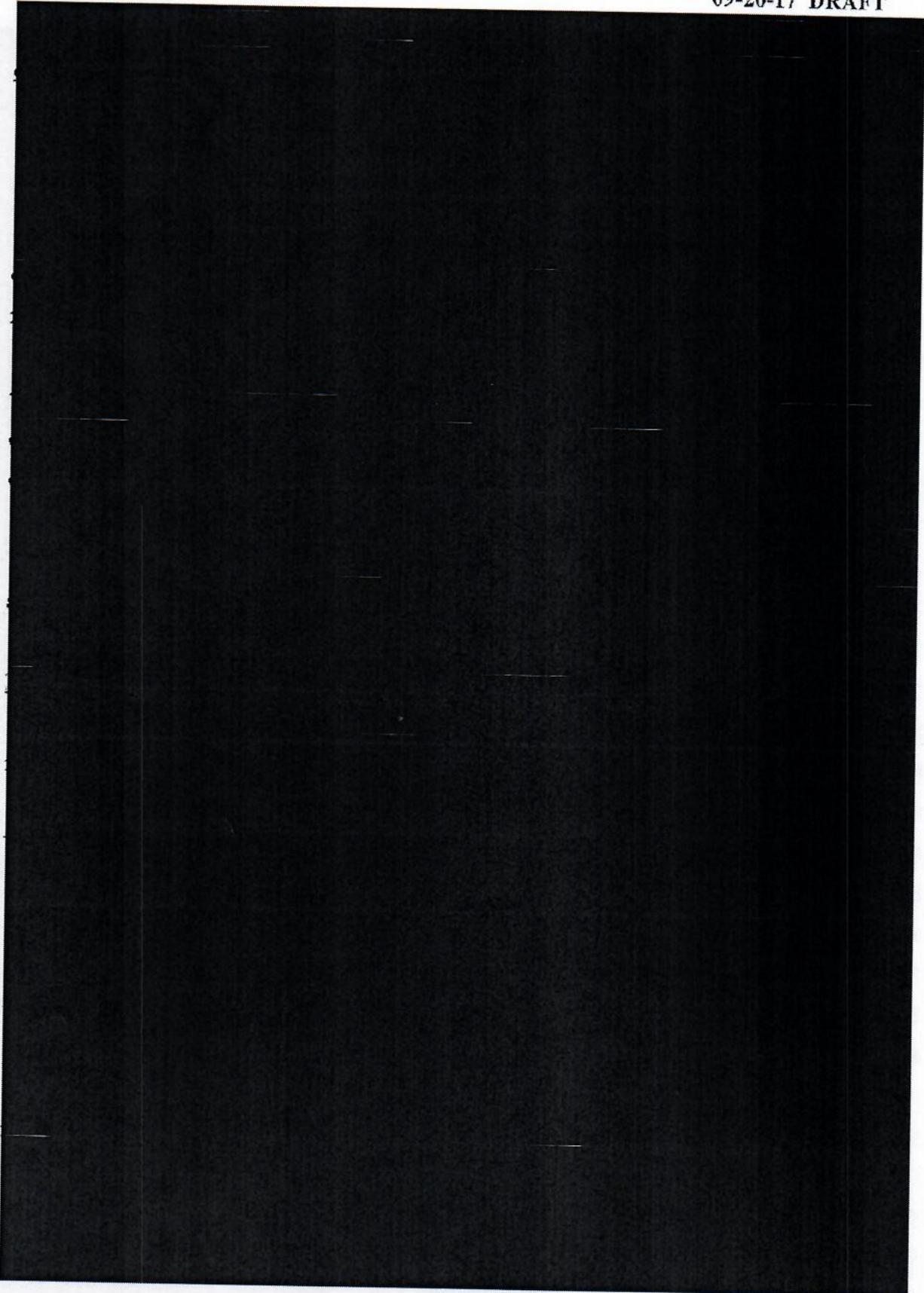
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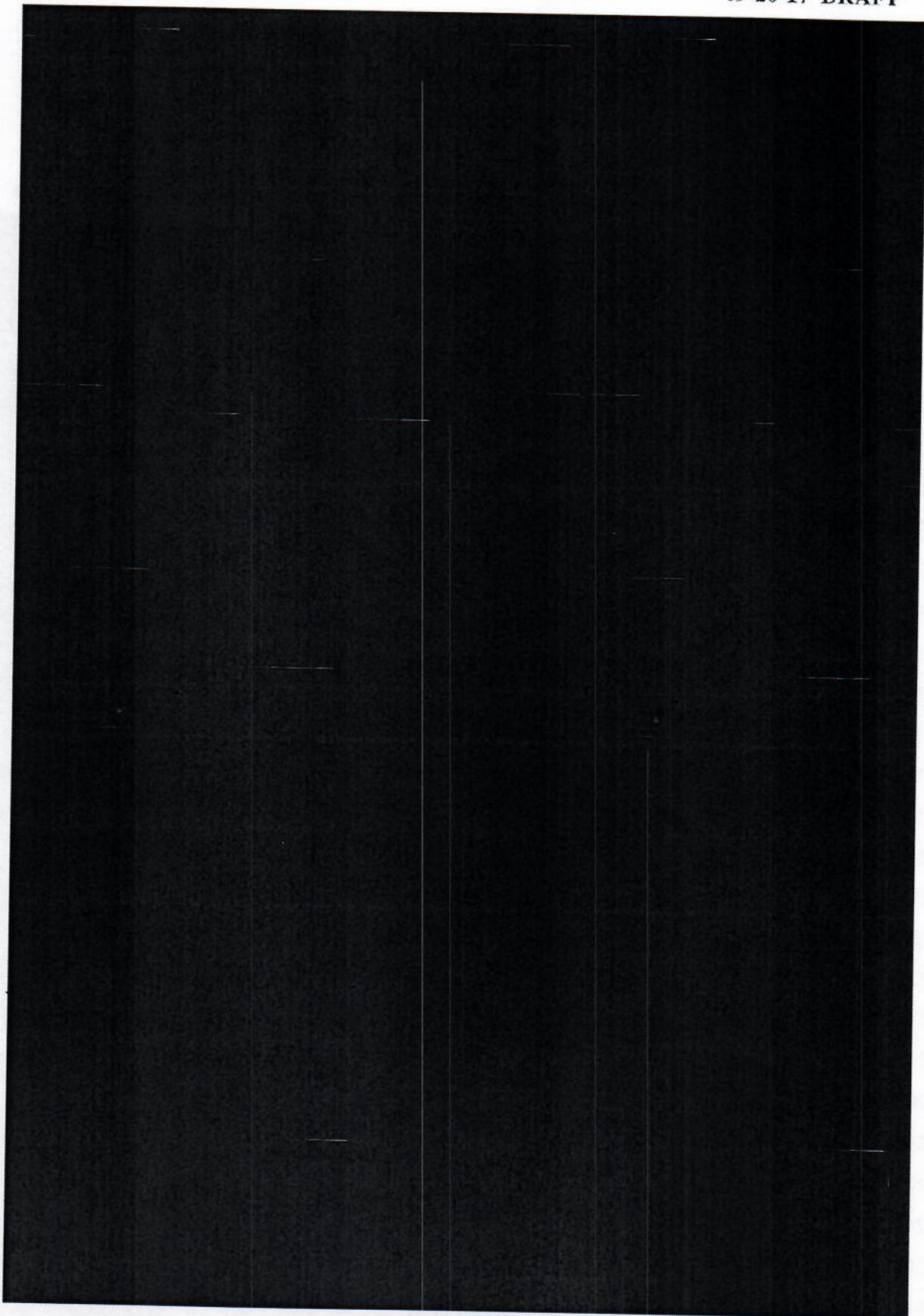
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I found some information about the Salt Lake Conservation District. It is a limited purpose local entity created under chapter 17D-3 of the state code. It share a lot of the same characteristics as a local district. But they have their own election process that is run by the Dept. of Agriculture and Food.

As I glance over chapter 17-3, part 3, I notice there are a lot of rules governing their elections. They're not totally consistent with the procedures we are used to in Title 20A. For instance, to vote in a conservation district election, a person must: a) be a registered voter residing in the district; OR b) own or operate private agricultural land in the district and request a ballot. *See UTAH CODE ANN. § 17D-3-306 (2017).*

So, if I live in Ohio and am registered to vote there, BUT I own a farm in Salt Lake County, then I can request a ballot and vote in the Salt Lake Conservation District's election.

That's just one example I quickly came across. Let me know if you'd like me to take a closer examination.

There is a website hosted by the State Dept. of Agriculture and Food. Attached is a .pdf from the site that gives a summary overview, including information about how they are currently running their elections.

lived at for 16 years. On December 18, 2019, your office rejected the referendum packet because [REDACTED] and another sponsor had not voted in a general election within the last three years. [REDACTED] is a plaintiff in a lawsuit against your office challenging that decision.

On March 17, 2020, your office received a referendum application that again included a sworn statement from [REDACTED] as a sponsor. This application also included [REDACTED] as a sponsor. On March 20, 2020, your office rejected the application because [REDACTED] and another sponsor had not voted in a general election within the last three years. In addition, your letter noted that [REDACTED] are not registered to vote.

After receiving this letter, [REDACTED] went online and found that Salt Lake County still listed them as registered voters. Your office did not. Thus, it appears that sometime between December 18, 2019 and March 20, 2020, your office removed [REDACTED] from the list of registered voters.

[REDACTED] never received the notification required by the NVRA that would then permit your office to remove them from the registration lists. Moreover, even the most recent U.S. Supreme Court decision affirming a state's authority to remove voters made clear that the concern giving rise to the removal cannot be the individual's failure to vote. Instead, inactive voting can only be used to justify sending the notice based on concerns that the voter has moved. In addition, the Ohio law upheld in that case defined political activity to include the types of actions that [REDACTED] have engaged in for years. Further, and most critically, through his referendum sponsorship affidavits verifying his address, your office lacked any basis for concern that [REDACTED] had moved. It appears, therefore, that the action of removing [REDACTED] from the list of registered voters represents an unlawful attempt to punish them for not voting or, worse, as retaliation for pursuing legal action against your office.

Please take action to correct this matter and restore [REDACTED] registered voter status no later than August 25, 2020. I would appreciate your notifying me when this remedial action has been taken or if your office declines to take action to address this issue.
