- Equipment/machines will need to be delivered and securely stored a few days in advance and up to a few days after
- Hours on voting day are 5:30 am to approximately 10 pm
- We will need security and staff available
- We will assist with flow of voters and the county's COVID health/safety recommendations
- We will provide free parking
- We need a communications plan

2. Public Service Announcement campaign/messaging regarding 1) updating personal addresses to ensure ballots are mailed to the correct location and 2) returning ballots by mail. We can discuss using our "Lead Together" or "Driven to Assist" campaigns with this and should tie in Justin Lee with the state election office to ensure this messaging serves all counties and the statewide population.

Shall we all plan to connect around the first part of September to see how things have progressed?

Again, we are thrilled to partner with you and to assist Utah's voters. I'll work to get a meeting set on the calendar that works for all of us.

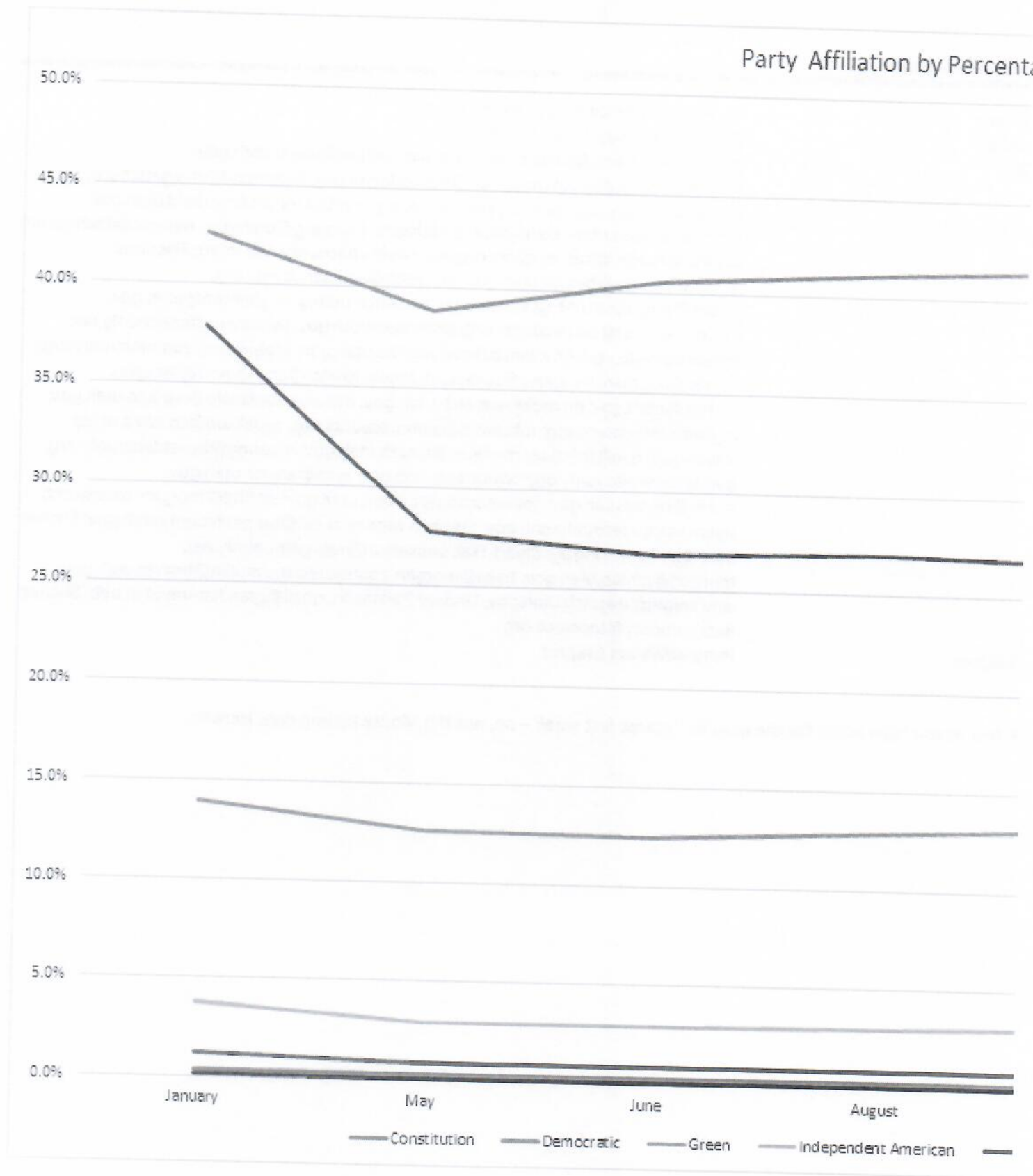

(c) EXECUTIVE BOARD.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after the last day on which the appointment of any of its members may be certified under subsection (b), the Standards Board shall select nine of its members to serve as the Executive Board of the Standards Board, of whom—

(A) not more than five may be State election officials;

(B) not more than five may be local election officials;

and

(C) not more than five may be members of the same political party.

(2) TERMS.—Except as provided in paragraph (3), members of the Executive Board of the Standards Board shall serve for a term of 2 years and may not serve for more than 3 consecutive terms.

(3) STAGGERING OF INITIAL TERMS.—Of the members first selected to serve on the Executive Board of the Standards Board—

(A) three shall serve for 1 term;

(B) three shall serve for 2 consecutive terms; and

(C) three shall serve for 3 consecutive terms,

as determined by lot at the time the members are first appointed.

(4) DUTIES.—In addition to any other duties assigned under this title, the Executive Board of the Standards Board may carry out such duties of the Standards Board as the Standards Board may delegate.


Therefore, all members who intend to cast a vote for Executive Board members must be present at this meeting.

We are attaching four documents to this letter to assist in the nomination process: (1) a copy of HAVA section 213(c), which governs the selection of the Executive Board; (2) the current list of Standards Board members with contact email addresses; (3) a table of executive board members and their terms; and (4) the nominations form. If you wish to nominate yourself or someone else from the list provided (please secure the nominee's approval prior to submitting), you must fill out the nominations form and return it to Clifford Tatum, EAC General Counsel, by 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time January 15, 2019. Clifford's email is: ctatum@eac.gov or you may fax the documents to Clifford at 301-734-3108. You may also deliver the nominations form in person to the EAC office, 1335 East-West Highway, Suite 4300, Silver Spring, Maryland, 20910. Please note: nominations forms received after 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on January 15, 2019 will not be considered.

Once nominated, each candidate will be asked to provide a short statement to be sent to the Standards Board membership with a copy of the sample ballot, which will be emailed no later than March 15, 2019. Voting will be held on the first day of the meeting, with election results to be announced by the end of the day.

The Executive Board plays a very important role in conducting the business of the Standards Board. Please give this nomination process your thoughtful consideration.
