Here's what I see as costs:

- Return Postage for cure letters. 63 cents per letter (cost of return postage + additional envelope)
- Per email/text: 2 cents per contact. (line 89 of the bill requires we contact the voter via each method).
- Additional labor required to call voters (although lines 85-86 may allow us to justify mailing first, then calling later)
- Possibly extra labor on Wednesday and Thursday after election day to respond (we used to have 7 days, if rejected after election day)

If you can, please let me know how many cure letters you sent out in 2020, and your total registered voters. With that info from just a few counties, I can come up with a statewide estimate.

- Voters – you MUST sign the affidavit on the return envelope. Comparison of signature on voter affidavit to state voter database.
- Return envelope is designed to protect secrecy of ballot
- Reconciliations throughout entire process
- Always two elections workers handling ballots
- Ballots are stored in secure locations at the county

**Sherrie Swensen, Salt Lake County: Preserving options for voters. Multiple ways to cast your ballot**

- Return by mail – must be postmarked before Election Day
- Drop box – can drop until 8 PM, when polls close
- Walk and drop. Voting assistance center – in person on Election Day
- Ability to track status of ballots on [vote.utah.gov](http://vote.utah.gov)



I brought this up to Mark Thomas when I came across it last year as I was reviewing the laws in preparation for canvass meetings. Our legal counsel confirmed that with this language, a voter could present a cure letter through the **conclusion** of a board of canvassers meeting.

As a result, I notified the city recorders where there were very close contests that they should accept cure letters up until the results were certified by their board. I and another staff member stayed here until the boards of canvassers meetings concluded in case a voter submitted a cure letter. If that had happened, we as a team would have retrieved that voter's ballot, checked the signature from the cure letter the city recorder forwarded to us and opened the ballot if the signature matched. The city recorder would have had to adjust their canvass report accordingly.

A deadline for when cure letters can be accepted needs to be inserted if this hasn't already been done in one of LG's clean-up bills.

(iii) that, in order for the ballot to be counted, the individual is required to deliver to the election officer a correctly completed affidavit, provided by the county clerk, that meets the requirements described in Subsection (5)(b).

(b) An affidavit described in Subsection (5)(a)(iii) shall include:

(i) an attestation that the individual voted the absentee ballot;

(ii) a space for the individual to enter the individual's name, date of birth, and driver license number or the last four digits of the individual's social security number;

(iii) a space for the individual to sign the affidavit; and

(iv) a statement that, by signing the affidavit, the individual authorizes the lieutenant governor's and county clerk's use of the individual's signature on the affidavit for voter identification purposes.

(c) In order for an individual described in Subsection (5)(a) to have the individual's ballot counted, the individual shall deliver the affidavit described in Subsection (5)(b) to the election officer.

(d) An election officer who receives a signed affidavit under Subsection (5)(c) shall immediately:

(i) scan the signature on the affidavit electronically and keep the signature on file in the statewide voter registration database developed under Section 20A-2-109; and

(ii) if the canvass has not concluded, count the individual's ballot.

I was just wondering if you were you able to find a bill to include the clean-up language to fix 20A-3-308(5)(d)(ii)?

**20A-3-308. Absentee ballots in the custody of poll workers -- Disposition -- Notice.**

- (5) (a) If the election officer rejects an individual's absentee ballot because the election officer determines that the signature on the ballot does not match the individual's signature that is maintained on file, the election officer shall contact the individual in accordance with Subsection (7) by mail, email, text message, or phone, and inform the individual:
- (i) that the individual's signature is in question;
  - (ii) how the individual may resolve the issue;
  - (iii) that, in order for the ballot to be counted, the individual is required to deliver to the election officer a correctly completed affidavit, provided by the county clerk, that meets the requirements described in Subsection (5)(b).
- (b) An affidavit described in Subsection (5)(a)(iii) shall include:
- (i) an attestation that the individual voted the absentee ballot;
  - (ii) a space for the individual to enter the individual's name, date of birth, and driver license number or the last four digits of the individual's social security number;
  - (iii) a space for the individual to sign the affidavit; and



# Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) Best for Utah?

Utah has been a pioneer in the adoption of RCV in Utah.

### RCV's Advantages

- RCV only changes the outcome in 2% of elections.
- RCV is a proven method for electing the best candidate.
- RCV is a simple and easy-to-use system.

### RCV's Disadvantages

- Only 2% of voters and candidates.
- Utah had a primary winner by default.
- RCV is a complex and expensive system.

This means that in just 2% of RCV elections, the outcome will differ from current elections.

## What option is best for Utah?

This depends on what issues we are trying to address.

| Issue        | RCV  | Approval | Runoff | Current |
|--------------|------|----------|--------|---------|
| Cost         | High | Low      | Medium | Low     |
| Complexity   | High | Low      | Medium | Low     |
| Transparency | High | Low      | Medium | Low     |
| Efficiency   | High | Low      | Medium | Low     |
| Accuracy     | High | Low      | Medium | Low     |
| Stability    | High | Low      | Medium | Low     |

### Utah Voters Deserve Consistency

Consistency does not exist in the election system. Whichever election method is best for Utah, should be used for every election. Voters should know what to expect, have clear expectations and should only have to learn one voting method.
