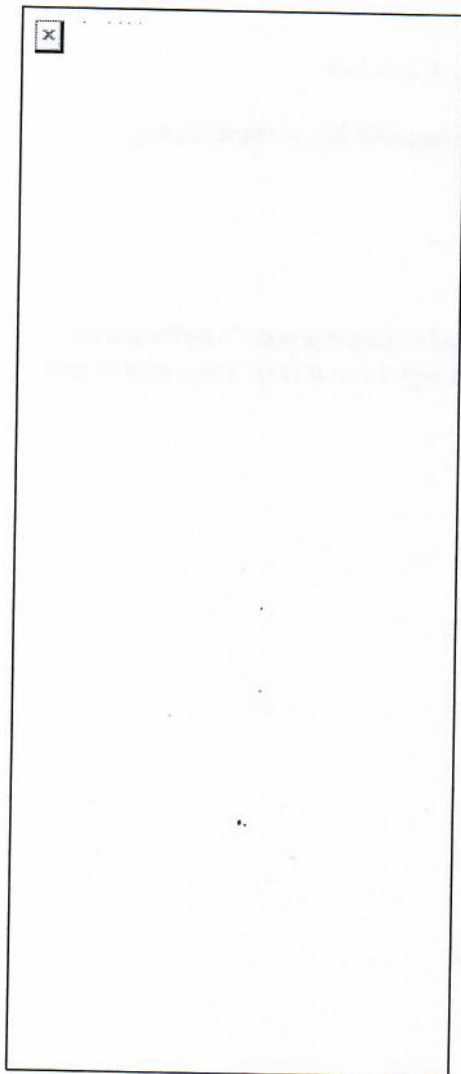

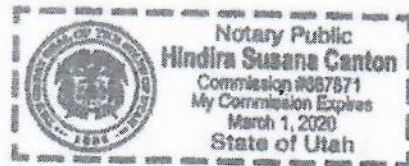

machine that she was assigned to. When she asked what it meant, she was told that the screen display said, "Ballot Cast". The poll workers then set about trying to figure out how to cancel that ballot so that [REDACTED] could vote. Concerned about leaving her class without a teacher, [REDACTED] left the election center at 7:40 AM to travel to work. Poll workers explained that they would figure out how to cancel her ballot and give her a call to let her know that she could return to vote. At 8:05 AM [REDACTED] received a call asking her for more information so that election officials could differentiate her from another voter with the same name, then, at 8:35 AM she received word that her ballot had been cancelled and that she could return later in the day to vote. She was invited to skip the line and come directly to [REDACTED] who would assist her. [REDACTED] left work 90 minutes early that day in order to cross town and vote prior to her evening commitments. She was able to cast her vote on the return visit.

LEGAL AUTHORITY

Title III of HAVA, section 301(a), outlines the minimum standards for polling locations used in federal elections. It states that all voting systems must be accessible to persons with disabilities. 52 U.S.C. § 21081 (a)(3)(A). Additionally, Title III outlines particular requirements that states must satisfy, including providing non-visual accessibility to the blind and visually impaired and maintaining at least one voting system at each polling location equipped for persons with disabilities. Id. § (a)(3)(A-B). Under Title III voting opportunities provided by elections officials to persons with disabilities must "be accessible in a manner that provides the same opportunity for access and participation (including privacy and independence) as for other voters(.)" 52 U.S.C. § 21081 (a)(3)(A).

SUGGESTIONS FOR RESOLUTIONS OR MODIFICATIONS

Poll workers should be trained to proficiently:

- 1) demonstrate the ability to position and set up a voting machine or ballot marking device in a manner that ensures that voters can vote privately and independently equal to voters who do not require accessible features.
- 2) assist voters using accessible features such as: the audio ballot, changes in text size and contrast, touch screen and key pad.
- 3) provide directions and assistance to voters with disabilities in a respectful manner, demonstrating appropriate etiquette for voters with a variety of disabilities.

Dear Mr. Lee:

This letter serves as a complaint under Title III of the Help America Vote Act (HAVA). It details the experiences of two Salt Lake County voters, [REDACTED] who requested the use of the audio ballot at separate locations in order to exercise their right to vote privately and independently. Unfortunately, they encountered barriers in this attempt. Subsequently, [REDACTED] contacted the Disability Law Center requesting assistance with the HAVA Complaint Process. Their experiences are detailed as follows.

DESCRIPTION OF VIOLATIONS

[REDACTED]

This morning I went to vote at the Trolley Square location (600 S. 700 E. #D-117). I was able to locate where they were holding elections rather easily this time because I was using AIRA (visual interpretation technology) which was able to guide me where to go.

Once I got to the room, I was immediately grabbed by a polling volunteer. I had to communicate, twice, that it was not OK for them to grab me! Once I got up to the table, the woman did not know how to access and give me an accessible voting ballot card. Because I have done this enough times, I was able to describe to her what she needed to do. Another polling volunteer also overheard our conversation and came over and assisted her. Once I had the card, I was directed over to the machine. There was only one machine with headphones but it was not in use luckily, I did not have to wait. The keypad was not plugged in because when my card was inserted nothing happened. The polling volunteer was right there and we were able to figure out that the keypad was not plugged in. Once everything was plugged in properly, and I figured out which way to install the ballot card (there are no



For every ballot returned by mail, we compare the signature on the ballot envelope affidavit to the signature on the voter's registration record. The signature is the version of identification that is required for a voter returning a ballot by mail. This is a copy of the signature box that is on the ballot return envelope.

The State Vital Records does a match of deceased voters in the statewide database every two weeks. If a voter is identified in that list as deceased, it puts that record into a "suspense" status.

We also check the obituaries on an ongoing basis and put voters identified in the obituaries as suspended in the database.

Often times the surviving family members notify us of a deceased family member.

We sent the ballot order to the printer on September 27th. [REDACTED] could have been deceased after the ballot order was placed. I could not find his name in the obituaries. However, the signature verification and the fact that voters are signing the **sworn affidavit** on the ballot return envelope, has secured our vote-by-mail elections.

If the caretaker had called us, we could have explained this to her.
