

Soon, you should receive an email regarding the establishment of your travel for the meeting, scheduled all day Thursday, April 19, and until noon on Friday, April 20.

For those interested, there are two other events on Wednesday, April 18.

The first is a tour and meeting the morning of the 18th at the Miami-Dade County Emergency Response Center. The presentation is intended to demonstrate some of the conditions the Center goes through during natural disasters, which often impact voters and elections.

Second, the EAC is planning a Public Hearing on the afternoon of Wednesday, April 18. The topic is cybersecurity, and the EAC is seeking testimony only from election officials, either on the officials' 2018 election plans, cybersecurity concerns in administering elections, or other cybersecurity feedback they wish to provide the Commissioners. Beyond the Hearing, for those who can't travel to Miami, the EAC will accept written testimony for the Record.

The intent of the Public Hearing is to provide an elections-industry forum on cybersecurity heading into the 2018 elections. We hope you will consider arriving early enough to attend both events and possibly testify at the Public Hearing.

More details on these events will be forthcoming as well. However, as you plan your travel, we wanted to make sure you knew of these events.

In the meantime, thank you for being a member of the Standards Board and for your commitment to the EAC and the election administration profession.

Dear Standards Board Member,

As a member of the EAC Standards Board, you previously received a copy of proposed modifications to the Voluntary Voting System Guidelines (also known as "VVSG 2.0"). These recommended modifications were sent to you on behalf of Commissioner Christy McCormick, the Designated Federal Officer for the Standards Board, and the Standards Board Executive Board.

VVSG 2.0 was unanimously approved by the Technical Guidelines Development Committee (TGDC) on September 12, 2017, and sent to United States Election Assistance Commission Executive Director Brian Newby on October 17, 2017, by the Director of the National Institute of Science and Technology (NIST), who chairs the TGDC.
