QUALIFICATIONS

Before the filing officer accepts any declaration of candidacy, the filing officer shall read to the candidate the constitutional and statutory requirements for candidacy, and the candidate shall state whether he/she fulfills the requirements. Other things to keep in mind:

- This guy's fraud is collusive and illegal, involving people (and apparently some corrupt USPS and election judges) who are willing to defraud voters.
- Utah law prohibits anyone other than a USPS worker, election judge, or family member for taking someone else's ballot for them. It's a Class A misdemeanor and the FBI is eager to help us investigate election fraud.
- Those who use ES&S equipment may have additional controls that would detect when someone returns a photocopied ballot.
- He also said that envelopes have too many security features to recreate.
