

vendors lists of how people were registered as of May 15 — as did most other counties.

"But there have been a lot of changes since then," she notes.

For example, former Democratic state senator Jim Dabakis urged Democrats to switch affiliation just for the primary to have a voice in the heavily Republican state for the many races here that are essentially decided in the GOP primary. Democratic leader Kem Gardner also wrote a Tribune op-ed urging the same saying the real Utah governor's race is in June, not November, given that a Democrat hasn't been elected to the office in 40 years.

So, people who re-registered since May 15 initially received a ballot for their former party. If they were unaffiliated, they may have received a ballot for nonpartisan primaries for local school boards.

"Most Democrats who re-affiliated understand that they received a Democratic ballot" and another may come because of the timing, Swensen said. "But many former unaffiliated voters that receive a nonpartisan school board ballot are like, 'Oh, I registered with the Republican Party, but I only got a ballot with the school board.'"

Swensen said all counties have the same practice to automatically void the earlier ballot sent to such people, "so it won't count if they send it in." And clerks send out a new one.

She said people have a deadline of June 19 to register or switch party affiliation and still receive a new by-mail ballot. Unaffiliated voters (but not Democrats) may also register as



If you recently switched from Unaffiliated to Republican, you may have been sent a nonpartisan ballot. **If you happened to have already completed and sent in the nonpartisan ballot before receiving your Republican ballot, do not worry. You still have the option to complete and send in your Republican ballot as soon as it arrives in your mailbox.** Your county clerk will then ensure that the nonpartisan ballot you may have sent in will not count. Instead, they will count your Republican ballot.

The same process applies to Democrats who may have switched to Republican. If you happen to have already completed and sent in your Democratic ballot, you can still send in your Republican ballot once it arrives in your mailbox. Your county clerk will not count your Democratic ballot, and will instead count your Republican ballot.

If you happened to have already completed and sent in the nonpartisan ballot before receiving your Republican ballot, do not worry. You still have the option to complete and send in your Republican ballot as soon as it arrives in your mailbox. Your county clerk will then ensure that the nonpartisan ballot you may have sent in will not count. Instead, they will count your Republican ballot.

For a fiscal note for SB201, we need to estimate how much money we would save by not needing to publish any notices in the local paper.

One way to do this is to see how much, on average) you paid your newspaper vendor(s) over the past 3 or so years. Not perfect, but probably good enough for an estimate.

As a reference, Weber Co. pays our newspaper approximately \$30K per year, on average.



I don't believe this happens in Utah, but a legislator reached out to me with concerns so I told him I would double-check. We want to do whatever we can to give people confidence in voting by mail.

There is a video circulating on social media that shows by mail ballot envelopes and included in the barcode number is an R or a D. The video claims this shows a voter's party affiliation and a malicious actor could identify R or D ballots and make sure they never arrive. ([See link to story here.](#)) I've also attached a screenshot of the envelopes the legislator sent to me.
